In a recent survey conducted by the Madras Institute of Development Studies (MIDS) in collaboration with the Department of Economics and Statistics of the Tamil Nadu government, a startling statistic emerged - only 32 per cent of women are actively engaged in the workforce in Tamil Nadu. This figure paints a poignant picture of gender inequality entrenched within our society.

Violence against women, encompassing intimate partner violence and sexual violence, remains a pervasive issue, constituting both a public health crisis and a violation of women's fundamental human rights. Such violence is not only a consequence of gender disparities but also perpetuates them, creating a cycle of oppression and injustice.

This reality serves as a stark reminder of the formidable challenges women face daily. From being confined within the walls of their own homes to enduring harassment in public and religious spaces, women encounter obstacles at every turn, often at the hands of their own family members and spouses.

Our Pride and Joy...

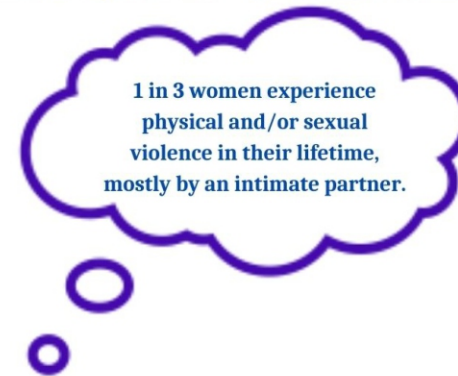
"I want to become a supervisor in the factory which feels like family to me. My life has been transformed now. I am a happy woman. Thank you so much for the opportunity."
